### SEPTEMBER HAPPENINGS...AND OCTOBER VOTE

September 7th, 2017

Dear Hyde Park Library Patron,

The Hyde Park Library District has announced its proposed budget for 2018. The current 2017 budget factoring in all funding streams is \$482,635. The proposed budget for 2018, as voted on by the library board, is \$475,239.

Of the total proposed budget, the amount proposed to be raised via tax levy for 2018 is \$441,212. This is the amount that voters in the District will be asked to vote upon on Thursday, October 12th.

The total proposed increase in the tax levy would be \$9,920.

The current tax levy on residents of the district is \$431,292.

The increased cost per \$1000 of assessed valuation under this proposed budget would be 1.3 cents.

The total annual tax levy for a home assessed at \$175,000 would be \$99.59. This amount would represent an increase of \$2.41 over the current tax levy on a home assessed at the above cited rate.

The vote will take place on Thursday, October 12th at the Hyde Park Free Library. Polling hours will be from 2:00PM to 9:00PM.

Registered voters in the Hyde Park Library District (the town of Hyde Park excluding those in the Staatsburg and Hillside fire districts) may cast their votes at that time. For information on absentee ballots, please call (845)229-7791 extension 205.

Copies of the proposed budget are available for public review at the library's main office located in the Hyde Park Library Annex.

In addition to the budget vote, three seats on the library board will be up for vote in October as well. Two of the terms are for a five year period. The third position is for a one year term. 
# And More Music...Acclaimed Canadian Guitarist and Songwriter To Appear...Concert AND Workshop
